1. PURPOSE OF THIS PRIVACY NOTICE

This Privacy Notice ("**Privacy Notice**") sets out how VOLTAGE Brussels NV/SA, a public limited company under Belgian law, with registered office at Excelsiorlaan 75 – 77 1930 Zaventem, Belgium, registered at the Crossroadbank of Enterprises with company number 0760.851.172 ("**VOLTAGE**", "**us**" or "**our**") processes your personal data in connection with our business, including the provision of our website at https://event.voltage.brussels/ ("**Site**")] and the services we offer ("**Services**").

In particular, this Privacy Notice explains our approach to any personal data that we as a data controller might collect from individuals ("you" or "your") (i) when you use our Site or Services (ii) during any other interactions with us, or (iii) which we might otherwise process when providing Services to our clients (including the personal data we collect, why we collected it and your rights in respect of our processing of your personal data).

This Privacy Notice is intended to assist you in making informed decisions when using the Site and our Services. Please take a moment to read and understand this Privacy Notice. It is intended to be read in conjunction with our <u>Cookie Notice</u>.

Finally, this Privacy Notice is intended to meet the requirements of the Regulation (EU) 2016/79 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data (known as "GDPR"), as well as any national or international act or regulation in execution or replacement thereof (together referred to as "Applicable Data Protection Law").

2. SCOPE OF THIS PRIVACY NOTICE

This Privacy Notice only applies to the use of your personal data obtained by us, whether from you directly or from a third party. It does not apply to personal data collected by third parties during your communications with those third parties or your use of their products or services (for example, where you follow links on our Site to third party websites over which we have no control).

Further, this Privacy Notice is not intended to cover the processing of workplace personal data. Accordingly, if you are engaged as an employee/personnel for us, please see our Workplace Privacy Notice which sets out further information about how we may process your personal data in connection with your employment and/or engagement.

In connection with your use of the Sites, you provide personal data to us in various ways. The types of personal data we obtain include personal data contained in content you submit, such as when you email us by clicking on VOLTAGE email address hyperlinks on the Sites. You are not obliged to provide this information but, if you choose not to do so, we may not be able to offer you certain of our services and features of the Sites.

4. PERSONAL DATA COLLECTED VIA COOKIES AND OTHER TRACKING TECHNOLOGIES ("COOKIES")

WHAT ARE COOKIES

A "cookie" is a text file that websites send to your computer or other internet-connected devices to uniquely identify your browser or to store information or settings in the browser. Cookies may involve personal data as well.

- HOW CAN I CONTROL THE PROCESSING OF PERSONAL DATA VIA COOKIES?

- To the extent required by applicable law, we will obtain your consent before processing personal data by means of placing cookies or similar technologies that are not strictly necessary for the functioning of the Sites or a service explicitly requested by you, on your

device. Otherwise (in case of strictly necessary cookies) we process your personal data on the basis of our legitimate interest.

You can also stop certain types of cookies from being downloaded on your device by selecting the appropriate settings on your web browser. Most web browsers will tell you how to stop accepting new browser cookies, how to be notified when you receive a new browser cookie and how to disable existing cookies. The Sites are not designed to respond to "do not track" signals received from browsers.

We do not obtain personal data about your online activities over time or across third-party websites, devices or other online services. On the Sites, we use third-party online analytics services, such as those of Google Analytics. To the extent required by applicable law, we will obtain your consent before using third-party analytics cookies. The service providers that administer these analytics services use automated technologies to collect data (such as email address, IP addresses, cookies and other device identifiers) to evaluate, for example, use of the Sites and to diagnose technical issues. 5. RECIPIENTS OF PERSONAL DATA

We do not disclose personal data we obtain about you to third parties, except as described in this Privacy Notice. We may share your personal data with the following recipients and categories of recipients for the purposes described in this Privacy Notice:

- (1) Our subsidiaries and affiliates (together with VOLTAGE referred to as "**The Group**") including, without being limited thereto:

- (2) Our international, including US, group companies, subsidiaries and affiliates.
- (3) Our service providers who perform services on our behalf, including data analytics providers. We do not authorize our service providers to use or disclose your personal data except as necessary to perform services on our behalf or to comply with legal requirements.
- (4) Government agencies, such as law enforcement authorities, for example in response to their requests.

We also may disclose personal data about you to recipients:

- (5) if we are required to do so by law or legal process (such as a court order or subpoena);
- (6) to establish, exercise or defend our legal rights;

- (7) when we believe disclosure is necessary or appropriate to prevent physical or other harm or financial loss:
- (8) in connection with an investigation of suspected or actual illegal activity;
- (9) in the event we sell or transfer all or a portion of our business or assets (including in the event of a reorganization, dissolution or liquidation); or
- (10) otherwise with your consent.

6. INTERNATIONAL TRANSFER OF PERSONAL DATA

If you are located in the European Economic Area ("EEA"), we will comply with Applicable Data Protection Law in terms of providing adequate protection for the transfer of personal data to recipients in countries outside of the EEA.

In case we transfer your personal data to a third country or international organisation (i.e., outside the EEA), we will make sure that your personal data is either transferred to third countries that are deemed to be offering an "adequate" level of protection by the European Commission (a list of adequate third countries is available on the European Commission's website), or alternatively, where your personal data is not sent to a country that provides an adequate level of protection, we will put in place appropriate safeguards with the entity receiving your personal data (e.g. the EU standard contractual clauses or binding corporate rules) to ensure that your personal data remains protected in accordance with Applicable Data Protection Law.

9. HOW LONG DO WE KEEP PERSONAL DATA

We do not retain personal data longer than necessary for the purpose for which they were collected. For example, we retain personal data we obtain about you for the duration of our contractual relationship, in accordance with our legitimate interests for retention or to take into account the applicable statute of limitations period or to comply with mandatory applicable law.

- You may ask your personal data to be **erased**;
- You may **object** to the processing of your personal data, ask us to **restrict** processing of your personal data or request **portability** of your personal data;
- You may also **object**, free of charge, to the processing of your personal data for **direct marketing** purposes by contacting VOLTAGE at the below address or by using the unsubscribe button in each direct marketing communication;
- If we collect and process your personal data with your consent, you can **withdraw your consent** at any time. The withdrawal of your consent shall not affect the lawfulness of any processing based on your consent before its withdrawal;
